Director's Letter

Stacking Up! The Fayetteville Public Library continues to increase in usage each year. In 2007 the library circulated about 952,000 books and materials – a 10% increase from 2006 and a 251% jump from 1997. Fayetteville is clearly a city of readers, one reason this is such a great community to live.

Throughout the past 10 years, library staff has compared FPL to those cities hosting major state-funded universities, such as Lawrence, Kansas; Ames, Iowa; Denton, Texas; Champaign-Urbana, Illinois; Iowa City, Iowa; and Columbia, Missouri. Ten years ago the Fayetteville Public Library lagged far behind these libraries in use, number of staff and hours open, funding and other key measures. Library staff listened to the community's needs and diligently sought creative ways to meet and fund them. In 2004, Blair Library opened, and the following year, the library received the 2005 Library of the Year award for improvement efforts. The 2007 usage measures demonstrate that the library is catching up and even exceeding some of these communities.

In 2007:

- More than 2,600 books, digital books and materials checked out daily.
- Approximately 2,000 people visited the library each day.
- More than 1,000 programs were offered to the public.
- Approximately 50,000 people attended library programs.
- More than 200 reference questions were answered each day.

The library's strategic plan, crafted with community input and approved in late 2006, led the way to more service improvements in 2007. They are:

- Added three hours of operation each week.
- Added three remote returns at the Bank of Fayetteville branches on College Avenue, Mission Boulevard and Wedington Drive.
- Expanded the library's website to include local obituary information for genealogists and historians, as well as a Community Wiki of local non-profit resources.
- Upgraded internet bandwidth.
- Made laptops available for checkout within the library.
- Added a public fax service.
- Implemented credit card payment for fees and merchandise.
- Established the Non-Profit Resource Center to serve the area's 500 non-profit organizations.
- In partnership with the local Optimists' Club, established Opti-Learn Peer Tutoring Program for high school students.
- Reached out to at-risk and incarcerated teens to teach basic life skills through a Community Development Block Grant.
- Reached underserved preschoolers through the volunteer-driven Reading Roadshow.
- Through a gift from the Washington County Law Library, received access to Westlaw online legal research database.

The strategic plan set a goal of increasing the visibility of the library's services. A revamped newsletter, "Exclamation," was produced monthly, and a listserv was established to alert patrons of upcoming events.

Blair Library continues to draw attention from tourists, media, visiting dignitaries and area businesses seeking to attract employees. In April, the library was named an American Green Landmark Library by *TravelSmart Newsletter* for the cutting edge use of energy efficient architecture and construction, and, in late summer, the library won the *Voices of Youth Advocates* Annual Teen Program Roundup's Most Valuable Program award.

A key goal for the library is sustainable funding. In 2007, thanks to both the library's Foundation and Friends of the Library, private funding increased to more than \$300,000 – making the difference between a good library and a great one.

To further develop that capability, the library received a coveted National Endowment for the Humanities Challenge Grant. During the next five years, the Library will raise a triple match to the \$600,000 challenge. Once met, the library will have a \$2 million endowment for humanities collections and programs.

These are the highlights of the work the library has undertaken to continue its service improvements, fulfill its mission and realize the vision of becoming a "powerfully relevant and completely accessible" library. There's no question that progress is being made. While Fayetteville is experiencing a downturn in sales tax revenues, the library will continue to seek ways to sustain its funding and provide services to the people of Fayetteville.

These are exciting times for the Fayetteville Public Library. Not only is the library busier than ever, open more hours and offering the very best collections, digital resources and programs, it is expanding its reach into the community and out to those most in need of library services. The library's continued success would not be possible without the support of the library's Board of Trustees, elected officials, FPL Foundation members, Friends of the Library members, sponsors and donors, volunteers and dedicated library staff.

We look forward to another year full of opportunities to serve the Fayetteville community in both traditional and innovative ways.

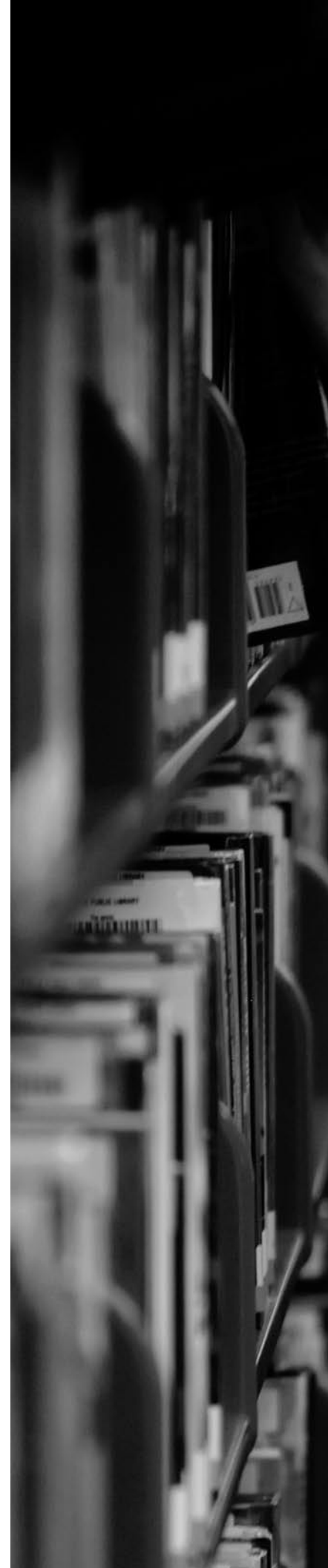
Stacking Up in Circulation


The Fayetteville Public Library is much more than a house for books.

The library has more than 238,000 items, including DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, laptops and parenting kits.

Community members realize this and are checking out items at a record pace. In 2007, 951,872 items were checked out – a 10 percent increase from 2006. Use of the library has increased steadily since 2004 when Blair Library opened. In 2007, the number of cardholders increased 14 percent to 61,419.

Visitors to the library come for a variety of reasons: to relax with a book in one of the many plush chairs, buy a coffee at Arsaga's Espresso Café or to use one of the library's 112 public computers. Other guests come to attend events or simply take advantage of the floor-to-ceiling windows that provide natural lighting and excellent views of the city.

Stacking Up in Services

The library's southern terrace, with its sweeping views of the Boston Mountains, is just one of the many special places patrons can sit with a laptop.

And if you forgot your laptop at home, don't worry.

At the Fayetteville Public Library, laptops are just one of the many things available for patrons to check out. In 2007, 4,209 patrons used the wireless access for 15,490 hours – a whopping 41 percent increase in the number of hours from 2006 when 3,276 patrons used the wireless service for 11,004 hours.

Library patrons are increasingly using their online account to reserve books. In 2007, the library filled 43,748 holds – a 53 percent increase from the previous year.

It's no wonder. There are plenty of items to reserve. The library also offers the latest best-sellers, DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, Playaways and parenting kits in its collection of more than 238,000 items. In the past year, the library added more than 22,000 items to its selection.

The library also has a vast collection of digital resources, accessible to Fayetteville Public Library patrons through their nearest computer – whether at home, work or at the library. These online resources aid in everything from test preparation for high school and college exams to starting a small business.

Stacking Up in Programming

Storytimes, like this *Preschool Storytime*, are almost daily occurrences at the Fayetteville Public Library.

The library offers programs for all ages, from its littlest library users – beginning with Baby Bookworm programs – to computer classes that teach adults how to set up an email account.

The Fayetteville Public Library offered more than 1,000 programs in 2007. Those include storytimes, which are offered five days a week and serve babies through 5-year-olds. Other programs include after school workshops for elementary students, Teen Anime and Teen Knitting clubs, three adult book clubs and a film club.

The Fayetteville Public Library also offers programs that feature special guest speakers. In 2007, those speakers included Judith Krug, executive director of the American Library Association's Office of Intellectual Freedom, Nancy Giles, a TV and film personality who provides commentary for CBS News' *Sunday Morning*, and Anthony Bourdain, chef, author and host of *No Reservations* on the Travel Channel. Bourdain's visit brought more than 600 people to the library.

Stacking Up for the Community

The community is what makes the Fayetteville Public Library a special place, whether it's the patrons who visit the library or volunteers who work to make the library a better place.

The library has more than 155 volunteers who contributed about 14,000 hours of service in 2007 – the equivalent of 7 full time employees.

Library volunteers serve in a variety of capacities at Blair Library, from working in the Friends bookstore to repairing damaged books to helping with children's programming. Volunteers also bring the library to the community through the Lending Hands program, which delivers library material to homebound Fayetteville residents, and through Reading Roadshow, which brings library storytimes to local Head Starts, the Richardson Center, Children's House and other organizations.

July 21

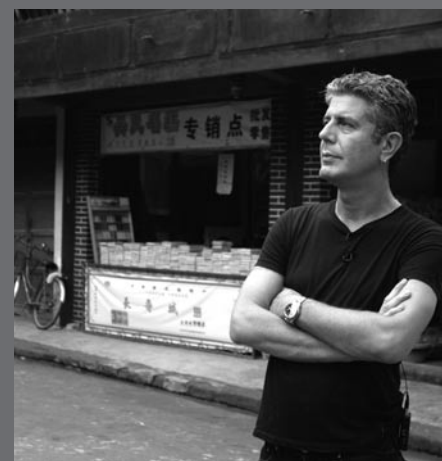
The library hosted a celebration for the release of the seventh and final Harry Potter book, *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*.
