# Anti-Racism Titles for Teens (Non-Fiction)

## ***So You Want to Talk About Race***

Ijeoma Oluo (Teen Non-Fiction 305.8009 Olu) 2018

This contemporary look at race in America has the “honest conversations about race and racism, and how they infect almost every aspect of American life,” hitting topics from intersectionality to micro-aggressions.

## ***The Black Lives Matter Movement***

Peggy Parks (Teen Non-Fiction 323.1196 Par) 2018

This book explores the Black Lives Matter movement that was launched in 2013 to address civil rights issues against African American citizens, and its appeal for equality and fair treatment of black citizens by law enforcement and by society as a whole.

## ***Taking a Knee, Taking a Stand***

Bob Schron (Teen Non-Fiction 796.0899) 2020

A decade-by-decade account of African-American athlete activism told through the stories of prominent athletes who fought for racial or gender equality, often at the expense of their reputation or their ability to practice their sport.

## ***Say Her Name***

Zetta Elliott (Teen Non-Fiction 811.63 Ell) 2020

Inspired by the #SayHerName campaign launched by the African American Policy Forum, these poems pay tribute to victims of police brutality as well as the activists insisting that Black Lives Matter.

## ***Privilege in America***

Gary Wiener, editor (Teen Non-Fiction 303.3 Pri) 2020

Opposing viewpoints on how privilege applies to race, gender, and wealth.

## ***We Are Not Yet Equal: Understanding Our Racial Divide***

Carol Anderson (Teen Non-Fiction 323.1196 And) 2018

A young adult adaptation of White Rage, this book examines how 5 moments of American racial progress were met with racist backlash.

## ***This Book is Anti-Racist***

Tiffany Jewell (Teen Non-Fiction 305.8009 Jew) 2020

This book is written so children and young adults will feel empowered to stand up to the adults who continue to close doors in their faces. This book will give them the language and ability to understand racism and a drive to undo it.

## ***Stamped: Racism, Antiracism, and You***

Jason Reynolds and Ibram X. Kendi (Teen New Non-Fiction 305.8009 Rey) 2020

A history of racist and antiracist ideas in America, from their roots in Europe until today.
